



# Syria Earthquake: Syrian Arab Red Crescent Response

7.8 Magnitude

From 6<sup>th</sup> Feb 2023 to 20<sup>th</sup> Feb 2023

## SARC Response:

Targeted people **2.5M**

SARC provided **1.7M** services, that cover the needs of **1.8M** people assisted.

**1.1M** services provided by the disaster management team

**958** cases responded to by the emergency medical services team.

**389.8K** medical services provided by health department

**43.7K** services provided by the protection and community services team.

**123K** services provided by the water and rehabilitation team

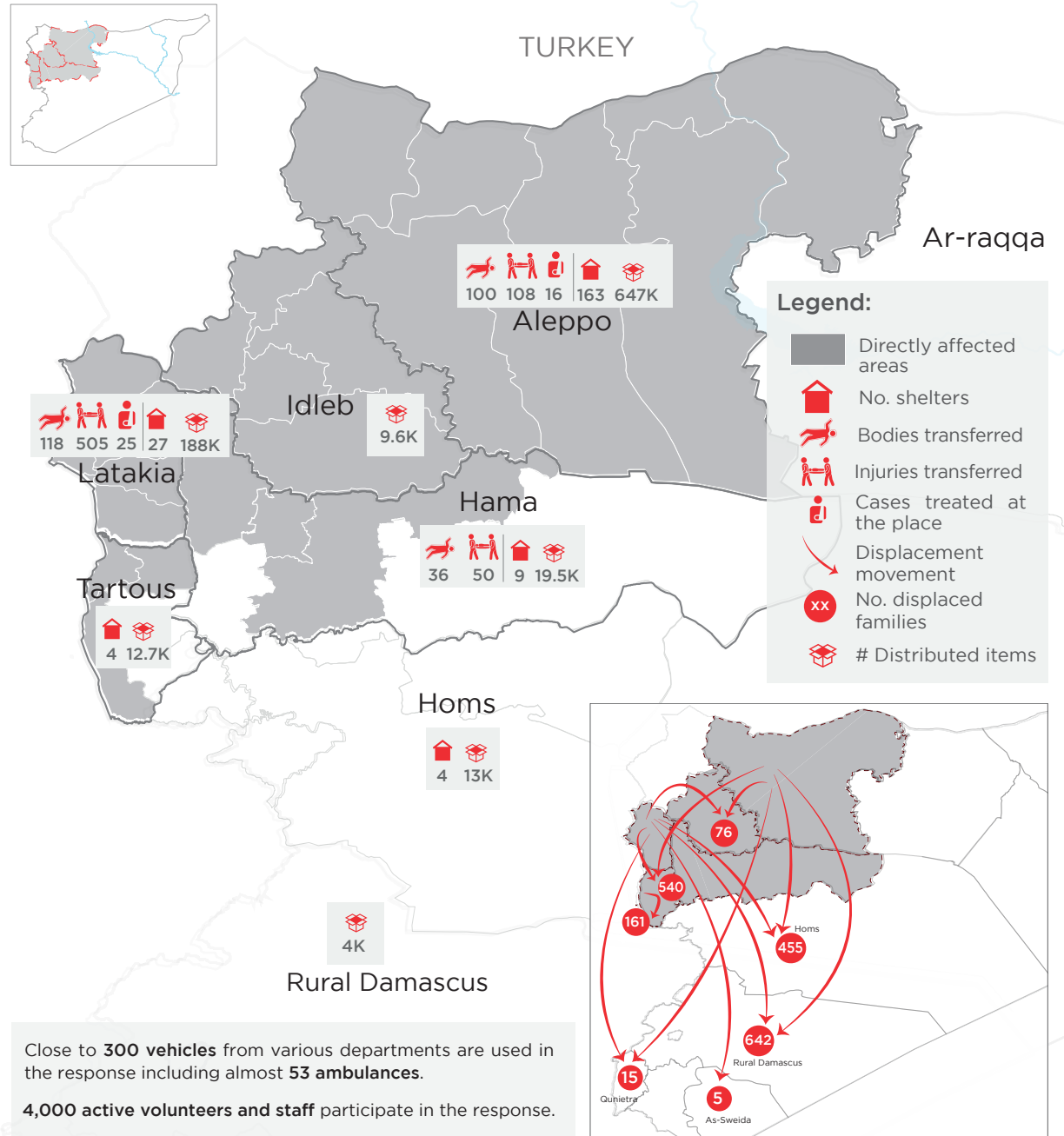
**48.8K** legal services provided by the legal services team.

More than **1.5K** logistic services provided.

**12** warehouses, used for the response  
**1,311** logistic missions

SARC received **humanitarian aid** support through **143** planes from various international communities.

The exact number of beneficiaries cannot be counted accurately during the response.



During the earthquake response, the Syrian Arab Red Crescent mobilized all operational teams from all departments within the sectors concerned in the response, and the following services were provided:

## Emergency Medical Services:

958 cases responded to by the EMS team.

## Medical Services:

The total medical services reached **389,863** services for **251,448** beneficiaries, as follows:

## Protection and Community Services:

Protection and Community Services provided services for **43,752** beneficiaries in the affected governorate as follows:

- Provide awareness sessions and distribute posters for **18,329** beneficiaries about safety and security measures in earthquakes, panic, dealing with children, grief & loss, and sessions about sex and gender-based violence, in addition, to running **43** focus group discussion sessions.
- Provide psychological first aid services for **20,049** beneficiaries especially for **children**, in addition to providing services in shelters such as activities for **932** kids.
- Case management services and referral to medical, legal, and mental health services for all age groups to **4,399** beneficiaries.

## Disaster Management Services:



Evacuating families from their cracked homes toward shelters.



Implement need assessments for **23,515** beneficiaries, in addition to an assessment for **207** buildings that benefited **4,749** beneficiaries in all affected governorates.



Organizing the movement of **1,894** families (9,470 people) from their places of residence to other places (**455** families in Homs, **701** families in Tartous (**161** families of them internally displaced), **642** families in Rural Damascus, **5** families in As-sweida, **76** families in Idleb, and **15** families in Qunietra).



**32** shelter kits services, including maintenance of windows, doors, water tanks, electrical panels, and cables, with all the necessary supplies for installation.



Received **44** cases for facilitated **restoring family links** by the body management and restoring family links team, **28** of them closed successfully, and the others are still in the process.



**207** shelters equipped for the response, **199** of them received families and are fully served by SARC's teams, as services were provided to **52,527** beneficiaries within the shelters.



**894,650** distributed items that cover the needs of **1,092,666** beneficiaries.

Non-Food Items & shelters: **238,184** items

WASH: **142,166** items

Food & Agriculture: **305,858** items

Nutrition: **208,442** items



## Legal Services:

The legal services provided to **48,807** beneficiaries as following:

- 30** beneficiaries from legal referral services.
- 2,444** beneficiaries from legal awareness sessions.
- 30,558** beneficiaries from legal needs assessments.
- 300** beneficiaries from legal communication & cooperation services.
- 9,899** beneficiaries from legal visits and monitoring.
- 5,558** beneficiaries from legal consultations.
- 18** beneficiaries from interventions before administrative bodies.



## Water and Rehabilitation:

- Implement rapid assessment for water and sanitation infrastructure, and electricity networks across all affected governorates, **200** houses were also assessed, in addition to assessment for **13** SARC facilities.
- Assessment of **195** shelters including **schools**, and **6** shelters rehabilitation in Aleppo.
- Provide **3** electricity generating sets for bakeries in Lattakia.
- Installing water tanks in shelters, side by side supplying (**2,450 m<sup>3</sup>**) of water through cisterns.
- Assessment of the damages of **55** central water tanks.
- Distribute **51,948** water bottles and **4,843** jerry-cans and **246** bread portions in shelters, in addition to distributing **65,522** items.
