



Syria Earthquake: Syrian Arab Red Crescent Response

The exact number of beneficiaries cannot be counted accurately during the response







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
During the earthquake response, the Syrian Arab Red Crescent mobilized all operational teams from all departments within the sectors concerned in the response, and the following services were provided:

Emergency Medical Services:

1,048 cases responded to by the EMS team.







The Medical Services:

The total medical services reached **488,441** services for **315,905** beneficiaries, as follows:

♀ Protection and Community Services:

Protection and Community Services provided services for 50,294 beneficiaries in the affected governorate as follows:

- Provide awareness sessions and distribute posters for 21,194 beneficiaries about safety
 and security measures in earthquakes, panic, dealing with children, grief & loss, and
 sessions about sex and gender-based violence, in addition, to running 43 focus group
 discussion sessions.
- Provide psychological first aid services for 23,137 beneficiaries especially for children, in addition to providing services in shelters such as activities for 1,036 kids.
- Case management services and referral to medical, legal, and mental health services for all age groups to 4,884 beneficiaries.

Disaster Management Services:

- Evacuating families from their cracked homes toward shelters.
- Implement need assessments for **25,185** beneficiaries, in addition to an assessment for **207** buildings that benefited **4,749** beneficiaries in all affected governorates.
- Organizing the movement of 2,184 families (10,920 people) from their places of residence to other places (543 families in Homs, 779 families in Tartous (161 families of them internally displaced), 749 families in Rural Damascus, 42 families in As-sweida, 82 families in Idleb, and 19 families in Qunietra).
- **32** shelter kits services, including maintenance of windows, doors, water tanks, electrical panels, and cables, with all the necessary supplies for installation.
- Received 45 cases for facilitated restoring family links by the body management and restoring family links team, 28 of them closed successfully, and the others are still in the process.
- 215 shelters equipped for the response, 204 of them received families and are fully served by SARC's teams, as services were provided to 53,342 beneficiaries within the shelters.
- Deliver a convoy with relief and medical items to Sheikh Maqsoud in Aleppo consisting of 31 trucks.
- ••• 1,079,728 distributed items (including convoys' items) that cover the needs of 1,451,324 beneficiaries.

☐ Legal Services:

The legal services provided to 50,656 beneficiaries as following:

35 beneficiaries from legal referral services.32,202 beneficiaries from legal needs assessments.9,965 beneficiaries from legal visits and monitoring.5,692 beneficiaries from legal consultations.

2,444 beneficiaries from legal awareness sessions.

- **300** beneficiaries from legal communication & cooperation services.
- **18** beneficiaries from interventions before administrative bodies.

🛶 Water and Rehabilitation:

- Implement rapid assessment for water and sanitation infrastructure, and electricity networks across all affected governorates, 302 houses were also assessed, in addition to assessment for 32 SARC facilities.
- Assessment of 215 shelters including schools, and 24 shelters rehabilitation in Aleppo.
- Provide 3 electricity generating sets for bakeries in Lattakia.
- Installing 3 water tanks with capacity (5,000 m³) in shelters in Aleppo, side by side supplying (3,150 m³) of water through cisterns.
- Assessment of the damages of 55 central water tanks.
- Distribute **56,808** water bottles and **5,758** jerry-cans and **246** bread portions in shelters, in addition to distributing **497** hygiene kits and **73,240** items.
